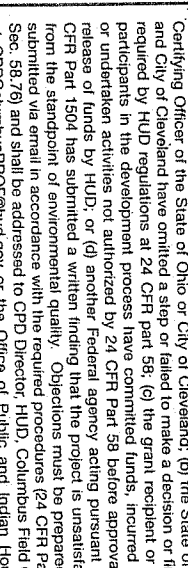
FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT
